Chairman's Annual report from Cllr Rosemary Abbiss

I would like to start by thanking Cllr Brian Hamilton Russell who took the Chair at the Annual Parish Council meeting post the elections 2013. Brian had done an excellent job in leading the Council for the last few years. Due to personal reasons he felt the need to stand down from the position a few months ago which was a sad moment for us all.

I was particularly sad that we failed to have enough candidates stand for election. We have always prided ourselves in having a full Council (10 members) We still have 2 vacancies if anyone is interested, it is not an onerous task and training is available which many of us take advantage of regularly. There are several fairly new Councillors who are learning how local democracy works within the parish. As some of us are "old hands" at the job we are always willing to give guidance if it is needed and together with the help of our very experienced Clerk, Mrs Freda Morris, we have full legal backing and guidance. As we are members of the Shropshire Association of Local Councils extra help and advice can be accessed through the office and any legal matters they are not able to give guidance on, the legal team at the National Association of Local Councils are accessed.

One of the main concerns to us has been the way our local road network has deteriorated over the last months and years. Representation continues to be made to the Highways Division but being "cash strapped" repairs are limited, but we can say that we do get a very good service from them due to the good liaison that the Clerk has built up with the officers over the years. We will continue to bring to their attention the areas needing attention. If anyone has concerns about highway issues please contact the Clerk and not Shropshire Council as we need to know what the issues are. She will always liaise with Highways without the need to wait far a Parish Council meeting.

Parish Watch continues to operate in our Parish under the leadership of Cllr Brian Hamilton-Russell and anyone seeing anything suspicious from a vehicle to persons should feed this through to him on 718577 and he will pass it through to the Police who may then be able to build up a full picture if anything comes from it.

Lengthsman Scheme: Shropshire Council give the Parish Council a grant each year which we are able to do small maintenance jobs at the edges of the highway as well as give some attention to footpaths, particularly in icy conditions. We have a contract with Willowdene Rehabilitation Unit at Chorley to take on these tasks.

As I became Chairman I sadly felt the need to stand down as Community Governor of Stottesdon Primary School a position I had held for a few years. This was done over much heart searching as it is difficult to let go of something that you have enjoyed. The School Governors decided that they still wished to keep contact through the Parish Council providing a nomination and at the February meeting it was proposed and agreed that Cllr Adele Millington from Chorley should take the position. I truly hope she enjoys getting involved with the education of our local youngsters as much as I did, which is a very important task. I close wishing to thank the help and support that the Councillors give me. I also cannot let the opportunity go in thanking Mrs Freda Morris for all the exceptional work that she does for this parish. She is very well experienced holding many certificates in local council and works many hours very often over and above her contracted hours. You can contact her at any reasonable hour during weekdays and at weekends in emergencies and messages left are always responded to. On behalf of everyone in the community, a huge Thank You Freda!

Fairer Funding for the Rural Areas: Report from Unitary Cllr Madge Shineton

Many of you will remember the Rural Services Network campaign and signing the Petition for a Fairer share of funding for Rural Areas. The Petition was presented in Parliament in November and there has been some success. Both Ministers and Civil Servants accepted that the rural areas have been treated unfairly for many years. Government has announced their final settlement for Councils this year of £11.5 million through the new Rural Services Delivery Grant, an extra £3million this year. In addition they have created a Rural Cost Commission to look in depth at the extra costs to deliver Public Services e.g. Health; Education; Transport etc. in the rural areas.

The last eighteen months all groups involved with health have been working together to streamline all sections of health care for patients and carers. With changes in the services available in the Princess Royal and the Royal Shrewsbury Hospitals, the new Women's and Children's unit and the wonderful success of the Stroke unit, we can see the start of providing the people of Shropshire with all round care from Hospital to back home. Please take part in the many meetings and consultation which will be being held in the next few months.

Stottesdon & Sidbury Church News:

We're rapidly approaching what is, perhaps, the most important Christian Festivals of the year so there's plenty for you to join in with over the coming days. All of our services are suitable for the whole family and a selection of books and toys for young children are available in both Churches. Sunday April 13th, Palm Sunday Procession. Meet in the parking area near Stottesdon School at 10:15am where we hear again the account of Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. From there, as the Church bells ring, we will make our way to Church for a service of Holy Communion. This service will be followed by refreshments served at the back of Church.

On Good Friday, 18th April, at 12noon, there will be the opportunity to spend an hour before the cross with a series of meditative readings and times of silence. Later that day at 7:30pm, we will be showing Mel Gibson's film, The Passion Of The Christ. There is no charge to come and see the film but it is a cert. 18 and therefore only suitable for adults (or teenagers if, and only if, accompanied by parents). Refreshments will be available.

On Easter Day, 20th April, Holy Communion will be celebrated in a short half-hour service at Sidbury beginning at 8am and a longer (one hour) service at Stottesdon beginning at 10:30am.

Sidbury Fete:

Do join us for our annual fundraising fete in the beautiful setting of Sidbury Hall on Saturday 17th May. Doors open at 6pm. We will have a wide range of activities and stalls for you to enjoy as well as children's races, a barbecue and plenty of opportunities to win some fantastic prizes. This year we are helping to raise funds for Holy Trinity Church in Sidbury and The County Air Ambulance.

Chancel Repair Liability:

Many of you will be aware of the recent publicity St Mary's Church has received over ancient rights called Chancel Repair Liability when twenty-five land-owners were notified of their responsibilities for a percentage of the costs of any repairs to the Chancel, the sacred part of the church, containing the altar. Concerns began to rise as soon as letters from The Land Registry started to arrive on doormats and the angst in our community continued to grow. The prospect of division in the community led the Parochial Church Council (PCC) in Stottesdon to carefully review and consider all the relevant facts and the PCC has now decided to withdraw the registrations from The Land Registry. In Stottesdon there are 87 plots of land and one family home (belonging to one of our churchwardens) to which CRL remains attached in the ownership of twenty-five individuals or estates amounting to 62.84% of any future chancel repair. Legislation passed by parliament required all churches with Chancel Repair Liabilities to register them by October 2013 or risk losing the rights altogether. Over sixty churches are affected in the Diocese of Hereford with hundreds more across the country. The consequences of Chancel Repair Liability in our parish have made it very difficult for us to carry out our prime objective of sharing God's love within our community. The Christian faith has much to say about healing and reconciliation, and we trust that this decision will help us to live out the message that we preach.

Annual Parish meeting:

This will be held in Chorley Village Hall on Monday 14th April at 7pm. Annual reports will be given by local groups and the Parish Council has invited Rev Colin Resch to speak about the Chancel Repair Liability. Mr John Clark, Hereford Diocesan Secretary will also attend the meeting.

Please come along and listen to what has been happening in the parish over the last year—this is the meeting of the parishioners!

Chorley Family Playgroup Annual Easter Egg Hunt:

Chorley Family Playgroup are hosting an Easter Egg Hunt for children on Friday 11th April, to take place in the village of Stottesdon.

The Hunt will begin at 3pm, at Stottesdon Church, immediately after the Easter service, all children are welcome to come and join in the fun! The event will involve a scavenger hunt based around the village for school aged children.
