

Complaints:

The Parish Council continue to receive complaints regarding the following:

- Speeding vehicles. We cannot stress enough that our roads are narrow and with farm implements and lorries getting bigger there is nowhere to go if you meet these large vehicles at speed. PLEASE slow down.
- Drivers using mobile phones please use hands free.
- Tractor drivers have been seen driving with children on their laps and using their mobile phones at the same time this is VERY dangerous.
- Dog fouling this is dangerous to young children as well as not being very pleasant. Please clean up after your dogs and use the bins provided.
- Horse manure on the roads we are aware that this is not as dangerous as
 dog fouling but it is unpleasant outside peoples houses. If you are able to go
 and clear this up please do so.
- Parking alongside the recycling banks in Station Road this bay is for vehicles to stand clear of the road whilst using the banks.
- Parking outside Stottesdon School/Glebe Drive. Please use the parking bays and not the BUS STOP and do not restrict access into Glebe Drive or park in front of residents drives/gates.
- Children playing on the roads both in Stottesdon and Chorley.
- Parking in the lay by outside the Doctor's Surgery is for patients and Doctors
 use. Please remember that there is a surgery every morning and also on 3
 afternoons.

This is not the Parish Council 'moaning again' but complaints from parishioners-if you have any complaints or concerns please let the Clerk or a Councillor know - these can be kept as 'confidential' with no names given at the meetings. It is not very helpful just to use the Shropshire Council Customer Services and remain anonymous as they often need further information and seek this from the Parish Council.

From the archives:

Almshouses 1703.

This seems to be in the dim and distant past and with no relation whatever to our 'world of today'! I know times change but it's never very clear whether it's for the better! Life now gallops along at such a pace, what with computers and the Internet and goodness knows what else! It seems that you can't do anything quietly on your own, in your own way these days but some person some place else can press a couple of buttons and say "I saw you"!

But, let us go back a short while, back to 1703 when George Rushbury and Richard Rushbury granted to trustees a piece of land in the Parish of Stottesdon, containing one acre. Known by the name of 'Tolleys Acre', in trust 'for the erection of Almshouses, to lodge some of the poor impecunious inhabitants of the said 'Parish'. The Almshouses were erected on this piece of land, the expense, amounting to £35 (!!) was defrayed from the poor rates and contributions from the parishioners. The houses, which consisted of five distinct dwellings, with a garden to each, were inhabited by, 'The paupers belonging to the Parish'.

The Almshouses and gardens now occupy only '2roods 17perches'. The remainder of the land was encroached upon by a man called Williams and his two sons. They later sold this with other property. This piece of land was irrecoverably lost to the Parish. The two sons were later transported and their father settled in Birmingham as a pauper.

("Be sure your sins will find you out", as my grandmother was wont to say!)

Hollow Oak Tree:

In a field along the side of 'Green Lane (almost opposite the Fighting Cocks) is an ancient oak tree, that has a hollow centre.

Mrs. K. Link burned it out in 1885.

I wonder what her vengeance was?

Children have often played in this tree. Sheep and lambs also use it for their shelter in bad weather.

A recipe for Love Sweet Cake:

2 shady trees

2 smiling faces

1 seat

2oz of love

4 lips pressed well together

1 waist well squeezed

Mix all together and cook for four hour's.

(To be served in the dark)

A recipe for Love Cake

6oz of love

2 smiling faces

2 side glances

4 lips well squeezed

Mix all together for two hour's, longer if necessary.

(Serve with sweets when dark)

Roads:

We have been working alongside Shropshire Council to get repairs carried out throughout the Parish with very little funding available. We are extremely grateful to Graham Downs and Andy Oliver at Bridgnorth for responding to our requests. Once again if you have any concerns please contact the Clerk or a Councillor.

Hedges:

Many thanks to all landowners who have already cut their hedges and look forward to others being cut at your earliest convenience - it does make a big difference on our narrow roads. Could we also please ask that any roadside trees/branches are cut back before the winter.

Road Closures:

Many thanks for your patience during the recent road closures - work has to be carried out on our narrow roads which unfortunately sometimes results in road closures.

There are 2 more planned road closures:

Brookland to Well Farm junction, Farlow (Section 50m either side of Farlow Bridge). This is for bridge repairs and will take place on 14th October for 2 weeks.

Lower Woodend junction to Six Ashes junction with B4363 for 1 day (8am-4pm) to allow BT customer fault repair.

Please follow the diversions during these road closure.

Notice Board in Stottesdon:

Could we please ask that any faded posters are replaced and limit sizes to a maximum of A4. Although this is a large notice board it is sometimes difficult to find a space. Any unsuitable posters will be removed.

Grit/salt bins:

Please let the Clerk or Councillor know if you feel that grit/salt is required in an area where it was not provided during last winter. Please remember that this is for use on the roads and not personal use.

Stottesdon School field:

Sadly we have to report that the Parish Council has made every effort to reach a compromise with the School to allow extra time that the community can use the playing field but this has been refused. As reported in our last newsletter the school requested that the community do not use the field until after 5.30pm (unless not being used) and at weekends as this is required by the Playgroup and School. It is sad that since the late 1970's the community has enjoyed being able to use this field after school/weekends and all through the school holidays that this has now been restricted. This is the reason why children have been seen kicking the football around Glebe Drive, the bus shelter and on the roads as they have nowhere else to play safely.

The Parish Council has approached landowners regarding any land which could be made available for a 'playing field' but have so far drawn a blank.

Report from Unitary Councillor Madge Shineton:

Shropshire Council have been instructed to save another £80 million over the next three years, this means there will be changes in what Shropshire Council can provide for everyone in the future. The Parish Councils in the County will be an important link to you when you need any Council services, and may well take over some of them, we shall need help from you all.

All rural Constituencies are collecting signatures for a Parliamentary Petition for more funding through Government Grant for the rural areas who have received as much as 50 % less funding than the urban areas for education; health, the roads etc. many thanks to all of you for signing the Petition at the Cleobury Farmers Market, Cleobury Library and other places. It will be presented to Parliament at the end of October during an early Day motion.

Nightingale Nursing Fund - Rosemary Abbiss:

Due to difficulty in holding the usual 5-a-side football competitions this year we are holding a grand raffle to help raise much needed funds for the charity. This will run until the middle of December when it will be drawn at the usual a Advent Soup lunch in Cleobury Mortimer. Please can I appeal to everyone to support this worthy cause which is helping people within our own community. Thank you.
