Chairman's Report:

This year we have brought forward the Spring Newsletter to publicise the local elections in May. It is important that enough candidates stand to meet the requirements to maintain our Quality Council status. Do please consider standing as a councillor whether you have previous experience or not. It is not an onerous duty but it is important that we have a full and wide representation of our community. We can even help with some out of pocket expenses!

The last year has been notable for many reasons. We hope that the children will treasure their Jubilee coins. The Olympics further demonstrated our need for improved sports facilities – both for the school and the community – and the weather has been a dominant factor, not least because of its effects on the roads! Shropshire Council has been doing their best for us and our clerk's excellent relationship with its officers has ensured that we get at least our fair share of repair resources including renewing the rapidly deteriorating roads through Stottesdon. Thanks are also due to Willowdene for their efforts under the Lengthsman Scheme.

We have continued to support the various agencies and causes mentioned in my report last year. A new project under way is the school bus shelter in Chorley. In spite of ever increasing costs we have kept the Precept for 2013/14 at exactly the same level as last year with sufficient for the new Council to keep ongoing projects in train. This is definitely my final report as Chairman and I would like to thank my fellow councillors for their support, their wide and varied expertise and good humour. Finally I must stress how fortunate we are to have Freda Morris as our clerk. She has now completed 26 years (approaching a national record), is the envy of all other local councils, works well beyond her paid hours and is the unerring fount of all knowledge that a chairman and council could ever wish for. Road closures:

Despite 'road closed' signs and letters/notices being distributed it is with regret that work was interrupted on numerous occasions to enable motorists to get through the village. The road was closed for health and safety reasons but many thanks to Shropshire Council and Ringway staff for their patience with a minority of drivers. Thanks to everyone for their patience who adhered to the closure notices. In our parish there are 2 more planned road closures:

Hardwickforge - section 20m either side of Hardwickforge bridge will be closed for 2 weeks from 11th March for bridge repairs.

Structural maintenance work is to be carried out at Prescott Bridge and the road will be closed for approximately 8 weeks. No date has yet been confirmed for this work. Information will be posted on the notice boards and on Shropshire Council website when a definite date has been fixed.

The work scheduled for the main Bridgnorth road will now hopefully take place later in March—weather permitting.

Elections:

The town and parish council elections in 2013 are being held on Thursday 2nd May when they are being combined with elections for the Unitary Council. The elections begin with the publication of the Notice of Election on Monday 11th March. This will be published locally in newspapers and notice boards.

The nomination period is between 9am and 5pm on each working day from Monday 11th March until the close of nominations at **12 noon on Friday 5th April**.

Qualifications to be a Councillor:

A person is qualified to be elected and to be a councillor if they are a British Commonwealth, Irish or European Union citizen and on the relevant day (that is, the day of nominations or election), they are 18 years of age or over.

In addition, the person must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- 1. on the relevant day and thereafter, they continue to be on the electoral register for the parish or
- During the whole of the twelve months before that day, they have owned or tenanted land or premises in the parish, or
- 3. During the whole of the twelve months before that day, their principal or only place of work has been in the parish, or
- 4. During the whole of the twelve months before that day, they have resided in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it.

Except for qualification 1, these qualifications then continue for the full term of office, until the next ordinary elections.

Certain people are disqualified from standing, and these include paid officers (including Clerks) of the council, bankrupts and those subject to recent sentences of imprisonment.

Bus Shelter at Chorley:

Glebe Drive parking:

The Parish Council provided 6 parking bays for short term parking mainly for school/ playgroup/visitor use during the day. There are also other parking bays in Glebe Drive which can be used whilst dropping/collecting children from school/playgroup. A resident in Glebe Drive has expressed concern with vehicles being parked on the grass opposite the parking bays in Glebe Drive which has in fact 'churned' this up due to the very wet weather.

Please remember that this grassed area is mowed by Shropshire Council and is not meant to be parked on!

Road problems:

Can we please ask once again that if you have any complaints/concerns regarding the roads (potholes/grit etc) that you contact the Clerk who quite often knows of any planned work in the area. We are aware that some parishioners do contact Shropshire Council direct and if this is the case it would be very helpful if the Clerk could be copied into any correspondence.

AED training:

Following the report in the last newsletter regarding the Clerk winning the defibrillator and handing this to Willowdene the Clerk was contacted by the Ambulance Service offering free training in the use of this machine.

If you are interested in being trained please contact the Clerk.

Dog fouling:

We have once again received complaints regarding dog fouling in the parish. Please remember that this is an offence - please clean up after your dogs. Posters have been put up in the parish and the Parish Council are at present considering new Dog Control Orders bring proposed by Shropshire Council.

Household Recycling Centre:

With effect from 1st March 2013 the new opening hours for the household recycling centre will be 9am-5pm every day, all year round (except Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day).
