Jan Snell Award

As you can see from the photograph on the front of this newsletter the Parish Council won the 'Jan Snell Achievement Award' and the Clerk and Vice-Chairman Rosemary Abbiss was presented with this at the AGM of Shropshire Association of Local Councils (SALC) in November.

Jan Snell was assistant secretary at SALC for many years before she passed away suddenly 3 years ago and was instrumental in training Freda when she took over as Clerk in 1986.

To be considered for this award the Parish Council had to demonstrate that they had achieved 'something special' in the previous year. We had numerous achievements which included the Clerk gaining her CiLCA qualification, the Parish council being awarded Quality Council status, partnership working with the County Council in providing the new parking area in the village and also the 'temporary' bridge at Winterburn Bridge being constructed to enable the road to be re-opened, the building commencing of the 6 affordable housing in Chorley to name but a few of our achievements.

The Clerk commented at the AGM that 'the award was special to her as Jan had helped her a great deal when she first took over as Clerk and it was an honour to receive the award in memory of Jan'.

Stottesdon Primary School

We are very fortunate to have this "outstanding" school within our parish. The present number of pupils is 63 and rising. Two full-time teachers and two part-time teachers support 3 classes. There is one Higher Level Teaching Assistant and two teaching assistants plus all the support staff that help this vibrant school. For a small school there are many extra curricular activities including Golf club, Netball club, Dance club, Hockey club, Gardening club and lessons on playing the Guitar, Flute, Clarinet and Violin. All of these activities are very well subscribed. The school operates an open door policy which in essence means that anyone is welcome to see the achievements of the pupils. Throughout the year there are many plays, fete's etc that everyone is welcome to attend.

Parish Watch

There has been a marked increase in rural burglaries in the Bridgnorth area in the run up to Christmas - only 1 in this parish. It may be linked to economics and could get worse. Please be very vigilant and report anything suspicious - the system is confidential and anonymous. Nightingale Nursing Fund

Sincere thanks go to the Cleobury Mortimer Players who allowed the NNF members to hold a raffle on their final night of their recent production. A wonderful £93 was raised for this the local peoples nursing fund.

On 3rd December Diane Newsham was responsible for organising another festive shop at the Fighting Cocks with the kind permission of Sandra Jefferies. This saw another £132 come to the fund with the same amount going to the friends of Stottesdon School. This was a superb evening with much Christmas shopping done from the quality stalls which were there.

11th December saw us joining with Cleobury Mortimer Senior Citizens Christmas Fund for an evening of Bingo. This was held at the Sports and Social Club, Cleobury Mortimer, with both funds receiving yet another £93 each. Thanks must go to the organisers of all these events. This truly local fund helps provide nursing care locally at times of crisis and is accessible through your District Nurses.

Glebe Drive Improvements

The Parish Council are delighted that the bus lay-by and the extra car parking project for the village has now been completed.

The land for both sites has been donated by Bridgnorth District Council and the work on the bus lay-by was done and funded by Shropshire County Council Highways Dept.

The extra car parking was completed by the County Highways dept and paid for by Stottesdon and Sidbury Parish Council through a Public Works Loan. The Car parking is now owned by the Parish Council for the Parishes use.

The Parish Council has written to the Bus Company requesting that the bus turns in Glebe Drive instead of the Burnt Pitt corner, which was considered dangerous, but although this has not yet happened we are monitoring the situation.

Many thanks to everyone who lives on and in the Glebe Drive area for their co-operation and patience during the work and an especially big thank you to the work gang for their efficient and prompt work and the officers who went out of their way to assist the Parish Council with this project.

New Parish Councillor

Mrs Rae Griffiths was co-opted onto the Parish Council in November following the resignation of Mary Meddings.

Rae lives in Stottesdon and has worked in Local Government for many years, which will be a great asset to the Parish Council.

Annual Parish Precept

Each year we all receive the dreaded 'council tax' demand from Shropshire and Bridgnorth, and sigh at quite how much money 'they' want from us this time! Included in the bill is the precept from your Parish Council which, although by far the smallest part of the bill (at just under £24 per head in this parish), is we feel worthy of an explanation from your Parish Council members.

Our precept pays for the running and administration of this parish; costs such as maintenance of parish-owned land and property, insurance, audit fees, and printing of this newsletter. In addition our precept is covering repayments of the loan which we took out to provide the much needed new parking spaces in the centre of the village and also Solicitors fees for the land transfer from Bridgnorth District Council. It also pays for the salary of our Parish Clerk who carries out a great deal of work in public and behind the scenes to keep our wheels running smoothly (in the case of the road repairs, quite literally!). This year we have been hit by a new adjustment from Inland Revenue in the way they require us to manage our Clerk's salary which has generated an increase of over 50% in the salary burden.

Despite these significant increases to our costs, our overall precept has risen only by 11% on last year. This cost management is due to our zero-based accounting policy (or bottom-up budgeting) which ensures that we only precept for unavoidable parish costs. This has enabled us to generate savings in other areas thus keeping the precept at what we consider to be acceptable levels. As always, any member of the Parish Council will be pleased to answer any questions on the precept or any other part of the Parish Council activities (our numbers are listed at the back of this newsletter), or we would welcome you to our monthly meetings.

Recycling

The Parish Council are aware that there are properties in the Parish who have not yet been provided with either the recycling boxes or black and green wheelie bins. Can we please ask you to notify the Clerk or a Parish Councillor as soon as possible if you have not received your bins and boxes - we will then pass this information on to Veolia.

If you have experienced problems with your collections can you please let the Parish Council have this information as soon as possible.

Brooksmeeting Bridge

The Clerk received notification on Wednesday 14th January that the Brooksmeeting Bridge in the Chorley Woods was having to be closed with effect from January 15th for several months. This closure has been implemented on an emergency basis after Shropshire County Council were informed that following a recent underwater inspection of the bridge it was found that both of the bridge's abutments have been substantially undercut by the river.

Also there will be traffic lights operating on the Priors Moor bridge near to Rays Farm bridge on the main road as there is also similar problem.

It is very much appreciated that this will cause inconvenience to many parishioners, visitors, delivery drivers etc. Complaints have been received that the diversion signs are not very clear, but as you can appreciate this road was closed in an emergency and signs have to be made.

Can we please ask that the diversion routes are adhered to and that everyone drives carefully.
