

Dear Parishioners

After much hard work the new surgery car park in Stottesdon finally came to fruition. Freda, our parish clerk, received the Jan Snell award for community achievement on behalf of the Parish Council in recognition of the huge efforts she made to see the job through. Mark Pearce has planted a beech hedge and various other plants around it and we hope to enhance it further later on this year with daffodils etc. May I remind parishioners that it is for patients and medical staff to use primarily so please observe the notices.

Hazel Barrett, my predecessor, continues to recover from her accident and we look forward to welcoming her back to council in the very near future. Councillors were very pleased to co-opt Dr David Powell onto the Parish Council at the February meeting. Shropshire Council has promised to deliver a long term solution for the "hot spots" around the parish so we will make sure they honour this. We live in an area of outstanding natural beauty but it saddens me to see the amount of litter casually discarded on the roadsides and in the hedgerows. However, it has come to the council's attention that some parishioners are fighting back. I'd like to congratulate Janette Chubb on her determination to help combat the problem. You may have seen her in action around the lanes. I'm sure she would appreciate it if you stopped and showed your appreciation. If you have the opportunity while walking the dog etc. please help to improve the environment by taking litter home.

Stottesdon acquired a Silent Soldier last autumn. Unfortunately he "lost" his rifle barrel but it has since been repaired. We are not sure who carried out the repair job but whoever you are, thank you. We have acquired one for Chorley too. We are considering the best place to locate it.

The guest speakers will be Julia Baron, Chief Executive of Shropshire RCC who will give a short presentation of the work that they carry out in Shropshire and Tina Ranson and Dee McNeil who will talk about setting up a Compassionate Community Group in Stottesdon. This is your meeting—please come along and listen to what's been happening in the parish over the last year.

Special News Item: St Mary's, Stottesdon

Stottesdon Parish Church has received initial support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for its "Past, Present and Future Project". Made possible by National Lottery players, the project aims to sustainably conserve this fine Grade 1 Listed Heritage building which is currently registered as "at risk". St Mary's Church is, by far, the largest public building for miles around. Uniquely in the present-day sleepy, rural village, it is the only clue to Stottesdon's former importance as the market-town at the centre of a Mercian-era 'Hundred' (one of just 15 of these historic administrative areas within Shropshire in about 750CE).

Development funding of £27,800 has been awarded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund to help St Mary's Church Council progress their plans to apply for a full National Lottery grant at a later date.

Community volunteers will be recruited and trained to research, and then share with visitors and residents alike, the fascinating history of the first-1000 years of the Church, which is believed to pre-date the Norman Conquest and is recorded twenty years later, in 1086, as one of just 23 churches in Shropshire which justified an entry in The Domesday Book.

News from the Churches from Revd. Mark Daborn

The main news across Hereford diocese at the moment is the selection process for finding a new Bishop. Richard Frith, who is approaching his fifth anniversary as Bishop of Hereford, has announced his retirement for November of this year, and all the processes are under way for finding his successor – who will be the 106th Bishop in a line stretching back to the Anglo-Saxon Bishop Putta in 676 AD.

But we shall be seeing Bishop Richard in our group of churches before he retires. On September 15th he will be visiting Stottesdon for a service of Confirmation. Confirmation marks the point when someone takes on responsibility for being a full member of the Christian Church, and is often the next stage after Baptism, or Christening.

f anyone is interested in finding out more about being confirmed do get in ouch and we can talk about what it involves.

Roads:

The Clerk has constantly sent in complaints about the state of the roads to Shropshire Council and at long last we have had a considerable amount of potholes filled temporarily. We are hoping that some permanent work can be carried out in the next financial year.

Many thanks to you all for your patience during the emergency road closures whilst repairs have been carried out. Roads have had to be closed for the safety of the highway gangs.

Please remember that the gangs working on the roads are acting on instructions from Shropshire Council - please treat these workers with respect. The flooding at the bottom of Moon House bank has finally been sorted after several years of complaints from the Parish Council. Please continue to send in any complaints to Shropshire Council, Clerk and the Shropshire Councillors Madge Shineton and Gwilym Butler.

Footpaths and Bridleways:

Please continue to report any blocked footpaths and bridleways to Shropshire Council or to the Parish council. This can be done via both websites.

Trees/hedges:

Please can everyone check roadside trees and hedges and cut at the appropriate time. We have previously requested this but there were several incidents in the parish during the last high winds.

Pease remember that Stottesdon is a Conservation Area and permission is needed for some tree work.
