Parish Councillors:

Sadly in June Cllr Jonathan Hill resigned from the Parish Council for personal reasons. Councillors expressed their thanks to Jonathon for his work whilst on the PC particularly with planning where his knowledge was excellent.

The vacancy was advertised and we are pleased to confirm that Mrs Beverley Montague has been co-opted onto the Council.. We still do have 2 further vacancies—1 for Stottesdon and 1 for Sidbury. Please speak to a Councillor or Clerk if your are interested or attend the Parish Council meetings.

Old Fox and Hounds car park

The car park has now been completed which we hope you will agree is a massive improvement. The signage is still to be finalised.

The project has turned out to be more costly than originally anticipated as we have had to employ 2 different Surveyors.

The car park is primarily for the use of the Doctor's Surgery and we ask again that cars are not parked on this site Monday - Friday 8am-6pm. The PC will be monitoring this and if we find that this is being abused then we will consider fencing this off outside of these hours. There may also be times when the Surgery hold their flu vaccination clinics on a Saturday when the car park will not be available.

The Parish Council are extremely grateful for the donations received from Brown Clee Medical Practice, Mr and Mrs Stephen Barratt and Col Brian Hamilton-Russell the remainder being funded by the PC through a Public Works Loan and reserves.

We would like to thank our Contractors G P Cork for their patience in this delayed project and for fitting the work in between jobs due to their very busy workload and to the Surveyors and Solicitors for their help and advice.

Thank you also to the Doctor's Surgery for helping arrange for Doctor's and Staff to park elsewhere during the work.

BROWN CLEE MEDICAL PRACTICE - PATIENT GROUP NEWS BULLETIN July 2018

Hospital reorganisation (Future Fit) - Consultation is taking place about the options for reorganization of services of The Shrewsbury and Telford Hospitals and you are encouraged to find out as much as you can and vote for the option you want. There are copies of an explanatory booklet at Ditton Priors and Stottesdon Surgeries, and information is available online at www.nhsfuturefit.org. There is an 'Information Event' in Bridgnorth on 25th July (Leisure Centre), where you can drop in between 3.30 and 7.30 to ask questions and give your views.

Changes to the Out of hours emergency telephone calls service. From 17th July all calls to the OOH service will go to the 111 call handlers. Shropdoc Doctors will still do the home visits and staff the OOH walk-in centres. Midwife Led Units in Bridgnorth and Ludlow are now only providing antenatal and postnatal clinics. There are hopes to develop the rural MLUs into Family Centres where all children in a family can be seen together. Keep Active - Brown Clee GPs are actively promoting activity to maintain good health and will be asking patients about their activity levels. The Practice is planning a 'Falls Prevention'event.

Men in Sheds - The Group meets for one morning a month and new members are welcome. First Thursday in the month 10.30 – 12.00 at Botwood Farm, Ditton Priors.

Compassionate Communities 6 patients are currently receiving companionship visits from trained volunteers. Anyone who would like to become a volunteer should contact the Surgery.

Ditton Surgery closure for 2 days while the car park is re-surfaced (dates to be announced) - patients will be seen at Stottesdon.

Parish Council meeting dates:



There is time at the beginning of each meeting for parishioners to address the Council on any issues of concern. Agendas are on the website and notice boards in Chorley and Stottesdon.

Silent Soldier:

As you can see from our front cover the Parish Council decided to support the Shropshire Royal British Legion "Silent Soldier" concept which marks the sacrifice of those who fell in the four war years leading up to the Armistice in November 1918. Commemorative events will be held across the United Kingdom during 2018, 100 years after the end of the First World War, and you may wish to join Shropshire RBL in remembering those who lost life and limb all those years ago. The Silent Soldier is the black silhouette of a First World War "tommy". It is anticipated that it will be displayed nationwide throughout 2018 as a powerful reminder of the sacrifices made by service personnel of Britain and the Empire during World War One.

Nearly 1.1 million British and Empire service men and women were killed during the First World War before the guns finally fell silent on Armistice Day 11 November 1918 and Shropshire RBL is keen to ensure that we in the County pay respects to those who gave so much. The figure is "silent" in remembrance of those who lost their lives, and "silent" as respect for those who returned to their home having suffered life-changing physical and emotional injury.

Thanks to Mark Pearce and Dan Romeo for erecting our Silent Soldier.
