Community Engagement Statement

Engagement with the community is at the heart of everything which the Parish Council does.

Aims and Examples of how we try to fulfil them:

- 1. To ensure that the Parish Council is fully representative of its community.
 - Residents are encouraged to stand for election or co-option by notices on the notice boards and the web site, in the quarterly newsletter and by word of mouth.
 - When co-opting Councillors an important consideration is that being a large Parish the Parish Council should represent as much as the geographical area of the parish as possible.
 - When planning applications are under consideration neighbours are normally notified by the Local Authority, notices are erected by the local Authority and the site is visited by members of the Parish Council. The Parish Council ensures that Members have access to all comments
 - Questionnaires are distributed and consultation meetings are held whenever appropriate,
- 2. To ensure that members of the community know how they can contact councillors and that they feel comfortable in doing so.
 - Contact details of Councillors and Clerk are available on newsletters and website.
 - Clerk and Councillors are well known in the Parish and always willing to discuss resident's concerns personally, by phone or email, as appropriate.
 - In the event that the Parish Council has a concern regarding a resident or local business it will be agreed by full council and minuted how this should be approached, i.e. personally rather than in writing in the first instance.
- 3. To ensure that members of the community know what the Parish Council is doing on their behalf.
 - Minutes of all meetings (except confidential items) will be published on the Parish Council website as soon as possible after being approved at full council meeting.
 - Regular information provided via quarterly newsletters, website and notice boards.
 - Chairman's Annual report given verbally at Annual Parish Meeting and also in writing in the
 - Copies of the Parish Plan and Village Design Statement (when adopted) will be available on
- 4. To ensure that members of the community know how they can influence the decisions of the
 - Notices of all Parish Council meetings include an invitation to the public session.
 - Residents attending the public session are welcomed by the Chairman and invited to
 - Procedures always explained to members of the public who attend meetings.
 - Information as appropriate is put in the newsletter and on the web site.
 - Public sessions are allowed at the beginning of each Parish Council meeting.
